LTE County Park Attendant: Duties include maintaining campgrounds, shelter areas, playgrounds, trails, boat launches, and handling special events. Candidates should have good communication skills, ability to work independently, and have some skills in facility maintenance and cleaning. Experience operating commercial type mowers and equipment a plus.

LTE County Parks Maintenance Crew I: Responsibilities include mowing, string trimming, tree trimming, planting, mulching, trail maintenance, facility maintenance, operation and maintenance of commercial type mowers and light and heavy-duty vehicles, public assistance and more


