
Earth Day Celebration with Opperation Fresh Start Stewart Lake County Park

The day will included spreading native prairie seed, clearing invasive brush, spending time learning about Stewart Lake, climbing trees with arborist equipment, learning about bluebird house maintenance, and transplanting native plants that were started from seed. # INDIAN LAKE PROPERTY PLAN

Dane County Parks will begin working on a property plan that will propose future management, recreation use and park facility development for Indian Lake County Park and the adjacent Halfway Prairie Wildlife Area.

Two public information meetings will be held to begin the planning process to gather public input:

- June 6 at 5:30 p.m. Town of Berry Town Hall Shelter




# KITE FLY-IN @ ANDERSON FARM


