

# PARK SAFETY & HUNTING

Please remember that hunting is allowed on a select number of our properties. Gun deer season runs from **Nov. 20-28, 2021.** Gun hunting is **ONLY** allowed in Dane County Parks properties that are designated Wildlife Areas. To see a list of wildlife areas, visit our <u>website</u>.



#### **Safety Tips:**

- KNOW BEFORE YOU GO: Hunting Season dates set by the Wisconsin DNR.
- WEAR BLAZE ORANGE or other highly visible clothing.
- IF YOU HIKE WITH A DOG, it should have a dog permit and wear a blaze orange vest and be on a leash at all times, unless engaged in hunting activities.
- **USE EXTRA CAUTION AT DAWN and DUSK**. Hunting activity may increase at dawn and dusk when animals are feeding.
- **AVOID HUNTER INTERFERENCE:** It is prohibited by Wisconsin law to interfere with people engaged in lawful hunting, fishing, or trapping (WI Statutes 29.083).
- BE HEARD: Make sure you are heard, by whistling, singing, or talking while you hike.

### PLANT OF THE WEEK!

This week's Dane County Parks Plant of the Week is, **Witch Hazel!** Witch Hazel's latin name is Hamamelis virginiana L. Mamamelis is latin that developed form the Greek word for service tree. Witch hazel can be considered a tree or shrub. It can grow to be 15 – 30 feet tall and the same length wide. This plant blooms in late October – December meaning you can find its bright yellow blooms right now in some of our parks! The flowers have four long, narrow petals which are pollinated by moths.

## GREEN FRIDAY




