

THANK YOU!

Dane County purchased 160 acres on the north-end of the Pheasant Branch Conservancy in 2019. Several partners have joined Dane County on the planning and implementation of site restoration that will help significantly reduce stormwater runoff, improve water quality, and provide habitat through a diverse mix of native vegetation. We want to express our sincere thanks to our project partners and their extremely generous financial contributions:

- The **Nature Conservancy in Wisconsin**, in partnership with the **Meringoff Family Foundation**, have granted \$20,000 to support restoration of historic wetlands.
- The **Friends of Pheasant Branch Conservancy** have granted \$25,000 to support the prairie and has pledged to continue fundraising for the project with a goal of contributing \$100,000 to the project.
- The **Clean Lakes Alliance** have granted \$25,000 to support the prairie and has committed an additional \$25,000 per year for three years for a total contribution of \$100,000.






WINTER RECREATION




