DOGGY PLAY DAY - ANDERSON FARM



PLANT OF THE WEEK!

Little Bluestem

Latin name: Schizachyrium scoparium

Aa small, compact grass that grows two to three feet tall. The base of the plant typically grows in a mound shape. This can provide great habitat for insects. This grass changes color with the seasons, going from blue-green in the summer to a red-tan color in fall. The white, fluffy seeds shimmer in the winter and are an important food source for small birds.


