


TOKEN CREEK RESTORATION PROJECT



TENNEY LOCK

The Tenney Lock is a popular recreation facility accommodating approximately 8,000 to 10,000 boaters annually. Located on the Yahara River, the lock allows for the passage of boats between Lake Mendota and Lake Monona. Dane County Parks is extending lock hours over the July 4th weekend:

The extended Lock schedule is as follows:

Monday, July 29 - Friday, July 3rd: 9:00 am - 11:00 pm Saturday, July 4: 9:00 am - Midnight

Permits

A **lock permit is required** for all watercraft using the lock. To reduce the spread of coronavirus, all Tenney Lock permits must be purchased online as there are currently no inperson permit sales. A daily or annual permit must be shown to the lock attendant (printed or displayed on your device).

Alex is a Landscape Architect and does planning, design, and project management for park and trail development projects. He enjoys hiking and hunting at the many Dane County Wildlife Areas








NATURAL AREAS ART FUNDRAISER


