IN MEMORIAM



Jim Hughes (1951-2020)

Jim loved the outdoors and was a longtime natural areas volunteer who worked to restore native oak savanna, wetlands, and prairie. Jim's legacy is found in the lands that he nurtured.



Dan Wisniewski (1946-2020)

Dan was a long time member of the Dane County
Parks Commission and a founding member of the
Foundation for Dane County Parks. He was a
conservationist with a passion for restoring natural
resources and an advocate for public access to cold
water trout streams.

CLEAN BOATS, CLEAN WATERS

Dane County has actively participated since 2010 in the statewide **Clean Boats**, **Clean Waters** program to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Our inspectors work at several boat landings in the county, talking with boaters about the aquatic invasives prevention steps, including inspecting boats, removing plants, draining all water from boat and equipment, and never moving plants or live fish away from a waterbody.

We are excited to welcome Khadijah, one of our summer interns from 2019, as the Clean Boats, Clean Waters Inspector this summer! She jumped right into the role and will be at various boat landings this summer to talk to and educate boaters.



FISH CAMP RENOVATIONS

Dane County Parks and the Friends of Lake Kegonsa Society have finished refurbishing two buildings at Fish Camp County Park. Improvements include reroofing, siding repairs, and exterior painting. Future improvements to Fish Camp County Park include Phase 2 of the Lower Yahara River Trail and Accessible Fishing/Boating Improvements including an accessible kayak launch.
