

LIL' EXPLORERS



PLANT OF THE WEEK!

Yellow Coneflower

Latin name: Ratibida pinnata

This plant has stiff and rough-feeling leaves, and showy yellow flowers with petals that droop downward around the stem. It has a grayish central disk that you can still see out in the prairie during the winter (see photo). Many insects are attracted to this plant, including butterflies and bees. It grows from two to four feet tall and blooms from July to early October.

- Develop and implement educational and outreach programming...and more!


